

Please follow these Regulations when attending

Lawnton Lake Development Site Regulations

1. No access to any other parts of the site, other than the most direct access, from the front gate to the lake area, and back, along existing roadways. Activities to be predominantly focused around the lake access points between the Lake with access to any other areas of the property regarded as prohibited.
2. Members and guests are responsible for their own safety while on site and must take every reasonable measure to ensure that yourself and native wildlife is not endangered. Of particular potential concern is the possibility of interaction with venomous snakes. Club members and guests are required to be aware of this risk and act accordingly.

AMPBA and BMMC regulations

1. Ensure that prior to entering that you have covered footwear on.
2. Obey the **10kph** speed limit.
3. Members should make every effort to either assist with set up in the mornings or help with storing equipment at the end of the day - preferably both.

Set-up:

1. Rescue boat is to be placed into water and tied off so that it does not drift onto course.
2. Fire extinguishers are to be placed at base of tower.
3. First aid kit is to be on hand too.
4. Drink esky to be placed in shade.

Anyone that has not been trained in rescue boat use, to be trained prior to being allowed to use.

Day fees MUST be paid BEFORE any boat goes on the water.

Club Days - \$10

Drinks are for sale on site:

Soft drink - \$2

Bottle water - \$2

BBQ Days - \$20 includes lunch and one drink (if not running a boat – lunch & one drink is \$10)

1. Members must ensure their shade equipment is securely anchored.
2. **After 8am**, model boat motors may be started.
3. No smoking/vaping in pits
4. Before starting your model boat, ensure the “boat stand” it is sitting in, is fully on the anti-slip mat or towel on the table. This is to stop the “boat stand” vibrating off the table and your pitman trying to grab it possibly causing lacerations to their body.
5. To help avoid any possibility of a model boat falling off any tables, please ensure all tables they are placed on, have a non-slip mat or towel on them. This includes down at the pit tables too. Safety first.
6. Ensure your model boat is fitted with a working failsafe as and where required by AMPBA rules.
7. Closed-in footwear *must be worn at all times*.
8. All boats are to be carried and launched with 2 hands, at all times.
9. All boats must be launched by a pit person, no launching of your own boat.
10. Do not enter the water any deeper than your midcalf.
11. When launching a boat make sure that the driver acknowledges that you are about to launch the boat, prior to actually launching the boat.
12. Boats being launched must give way to boats on the water.
13. All boats must be driven from the drivers stand.
14. There is to be no running whatsoever in the pit area. The edge of the lake is slippery and soft and will easily cause people to trip/slip over.
15. If your boat stops on the course and there are other boats on the course, you **MUST** alert all other drivers.

16. When returning to the bank do it at a slow speed and parallel to the bank, as there may be other members picking up or placing a boat in the water and you may not see them.
17. When your RC boat is at full speed, do not drive it directly at the bank, nor parallel within 10 meters of the bank, for safety.
18. **Recovery boat is not permitted on the water while there are model boats running.**
19. No model boats to be launched while the *recovery boat* is on the water.
20. When there are 3 dead boats on the water, all running boats must be removed from the water so rescue can take place.
21. DO NOT OPERATE THE RESCUE DINGHY IF YOU HAVE NOT BEEN TRAINED IN ITS OPERATION. Anyone that has not been trained in the rescue boat use, (please request training from club member).
22. Ensure that UHF hand held radios are working prior to anyone going out in the dinghy.
23. When in the dinghy, stay seated at all times, so that capsizing or falling out does not occur.
24. Always be checking for other model boats that are on the water.
25. When in the boat you are to wear the provided life jacket, to prevent you from drowning if capsizing happens.
26. Ensure all rubbish is taken from the site when you leave.
27. **Drinks are for sale on site:**
 - a. Soft drink - \$2
 - b. Bottle water - \$2

Pack up:

Rescue boat/s:

- a. Pulled out of the water
- b. Motor is to be placed on Kevin's trailer
- c. Rescue boat/s, put away
 - i. Club's in container
 - ii. Kevin's on top of his trailer

Fire extinguishers returned to their owner/s.

First aid kit is to be returned (to Kevin).

Drink esky to be returned (to Kevin).

Container locked

Pick up all rubbish and remove from site.
